What We Do

Through this unique and creative process, the children develop skills which they can later use to assist in job opportunities in the creative field and beyond. Forming crucial relationships with company's and individuals to helps spring board them into the South African economy preventing the return into the orphan cycle.

Why We Doodle It


It is estimated that there are 3.9 million orphaned children in South Africa with nearly half having lost their parents to AIDS-related diseases. The further exploitation of these children, coupled with poor socio-economic environments and stress, leads to cognitive, social and emotional problems. At the age of 18, these children are expected to be self-sufficient adults despite their lack of a stable background that fosters the life skills needed for success.

How We Doodle It


Through these activities, Doodle Your Future aims to grow generations of educated, empowered and positive youth and future leaders of South Africa.

Our Good News



Financial Aid during a world pandemic.



With the world in the state that it is in with Covid-19. We have not been able to continue our creative programmes that we had planned for the year ahead. However, as lockdown bans start to lift we hope to start implementing processes to keep moving forward.

We are always looking towards the private sector to support us where possible. One positive story to come out of this hard time, is that we have been able to assist our beneficiaries financially. The children's home, Oasis Haven has been under immense pressure in looking after our Little Doodlers. But, due to our incredible sponsors, donors and volunteers over the years we have been able to aid our children financially. Doodle Your Future implemented a process where 10% of every financial donation would be kept in a doodle trust account.

Every six months with our board of trustees and our beneficiaries we discuss where we can help financially. We have not needed to tap into this savings since the beginning until Beverley Beukes, the MD of Oasis Haven asked for financial support during the pandemic. We were able to donate R10 000 to assist in their day-to-day living expenses and needs. Although we are running into hard times, this donation has created absolute joy in our hearts and hope to continue to supporting our organisations even during times of turmoil.

The power of art and storytelling

South Africa's future depends on her children. Doodle your Future is taking a unique approach to nurturing some of the country's most vulnerable children through the evocative combination of art and storytelling. The story of Doodle your Future's birth provides the perfect example of the tangible healing that art and narrative therapy can facilitate. It started almost 10 years ago when I, became a big sister to Mary, a 3-year-old living at Oasis Haven Orphanage in Johannesburg. Mary was petrified of sirens, police vans and ambulances – to the point that they invoked an intense physical reaction of fear. Her father had been taken

away from her in the back of a police van, and her mother in an ambulance, so this fear is not hard to understand. But together, Mary and I started to create positive narratives around police and ambulances. What if a policeman helped a child find their way home from school? What if an ambulance helped a woman to give birth to a baby?

Helping Mary to make sense of her personal stories played a critical role in allowing her to process her traumatic experiences. This type of work forms the backbone of narrative therapy, a therapeutic which centres on listening to, building up, and changing the

perspective on personal stories. Mary and I didn't just discuss these stories, we also drew pictures to illustrate the stories we were telling one another. Research suggests that the use of such creative art techniques can allow for the expression of "the visual and sensational nature of traumatic memories stored in the brain without translation into the narrative". In young children, who may not have the vocabulary to express their experiences, the use of drawing can be particularly valuable.

To be honest I have used these processes in my own personal life. Over time, Mary's fears dissipated and she no longer

reacted with terror to the sound of sirens. This confirmed my belief about the power of storytelling and illustrating, and so Doodle your Future was born. Doodle your Future now works with 20 children at Oasis Haven Orphanage (our Doodlers).

The programme has expanded to include educational theatre, forming what we refer to as the magical three: acting out, illustrating, and writing stories. One of the great strengths of art and narrative-based therapeutic approaches is that they offer these multiple avenues through which children can express themselves and

learn new things. In this way a message is repeated and reinforced through multiple modalities, multiple neural pathways are involved in the learning process and growth and development can be effectuated in a lasting manner.

Our mission and Vision at Doodle your Future aims to take a truly holistic approach towards empowering our Doodlers to live up to their full potential, without trivialising or disregarding the difficult start they've had in life. We believe that they are not only doodling their own futures, but that of our entire nation.

Our Positivity Programme is designed to cultivate and embrace positive mind sets. Together we share stories and go on adventures that showcases issues and problem solving in the lives of the youth and minority groups in South Africa. We develop and design scripts for corporates, organisations and schools to create awareness and interaction with their desired objectives. 


Momentum Metropolitan.

Our Doodle Heroes


It takes a village to raise a child. Without the support and love from our Doodle Heroes, Doodle Your Future would not be able to positively impact the lives of our Doodlers.
